This funding will be used to

- Increase Semester Level of Achievement result in English , Math and Science to 85 % reaching 'C' standard
- Increase percentage of students meeting the NMS for reading from 80 to 85 % of students in Year 3
- Increase overall school attendance from 92% to 93 %
- Implement and embed " 4 Lesson Sequence" in the teaching of reading in Prep –Year 2
- Increase percentage of students achieving 'at' and 'above' school benchmark levels in "end of year"
- diagnostic reading and through the collaborative inquiry approach of reading demands of the curriculum
- Increase refugee , migrant and indigenous parent participation within the school

Our initiatives include

- Engage mobility officer to liaise and make contact with parents and carers regarding unexplained student absence, truancy and student well being
- Embed consistent school wide pedagogical approaches to teaching and learning.
- Utilise coaching and feedback models building teacher capacity aligned with the *aitsl* standards
- Offer a variety of learning engagement programs for students identified at risk or gifted and talented
- Continue developing teacher capability, inclusive of collaborative planning, coaching and feedback loops
- Introducing a meeting and social space within the school in the form of the Aitkenvale Cultural Hub

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Employment of STLN to support intervention across the school (\$67,000)
- Employ mobility / student engagement support teacher (\$40,000)
- Employ a reading / pedagogical coach building teacher capability and capacity with a clear focus on reading, and continuing to grow a culture of coaching, feedback and enhanced student level of achievement (\$105,000)
- Build upon our digital technologies focus by the implementation of further XO infinity laptops (\$50,000)
- Transforming unused building (K block) into the Aitkenvale Cultural Hub to be utilised by school and community groups for events, workshops and sharing cultural diversities (\$10 000)
- Transforming unused tractor shed into a flexible learning space for alternative, modified and enhanced workshop and design activities (\$10 000)
